

Welcome to Virden

In 1883 the community of Gopher Creek, created by settlers from Great Britain and Eastern Canada looking for opportunity and a better life, became Virden and an important node in the national rail system. The population swelled as the brick and flour industries grew in tandem with agriculture. The community became the hub of transportation, processing, and services for the greater region. Growth in population and the economy continued with investments in a Commonwealth Air Training Combat School during WWII, and the discovery of significant oil deposits in 1951 and 1953.

The sports and recreation communities in Virden are thriving. Local and regional sports groups make use of our arena (Tundra Oil & Gas Place), which boasts an NHL sized ice surface, indoor walking track, fitness centre and banquet halls. We also have an outdoor heated swimming pool with waterslide, curling rink, golf course, spray park, skateboard park, fishing pond, lawn bowling, soccer fields, and ball diamonds, along with many other activities available throughout the year.

Virden is home to the Virden Indoor Rodeo and Wild West Daze, an annual rodeo that has long been a source of entertainment and excitement for Virden and the surrounding area. Victoria Park displays beautiful landscaping and greenspace, and an outdoor bandshell is available for many types of entertainment performances. Annual Canada Day celebrations are hosted at Victoria Park on July 1st for residents and visitors.

"The Aud" Theatre (originally opened in 1912, and again after renovations in 1983) is home to many entertainment groups. The Pioneer Home Museum takes visitors back in time, while the CP Station has an art gallery that is sure to please one's artistic senses. The Border Regional Library offers many programs for a variety of ages and interests. Many of these activities are located in beautiful heritage buildings.

Virden has a strong service and education community. Virden's many churches and service groups work hard to make our community a great place to live. These groups are active in meeting the needs of Virden's residents through dedicated volunteerism. Virden has four schools and many organizations who strive to bring education and literacy opportunities to residents.

Virden is located, quite literally, at the Centre of It All. Located on the Trans-Canada Highway and the cross-Canada CPR line, Virden is also on Highway 83, which bisects the entire continent, running over 3000 km straight south to the Gulf of Mexico - known as the 'Palms to Pines' route. We are centered between two provincial capitals, and at the virtual centre of the nation's east and west coasts. With our diverse natural resources, thriving agricultural industries, abundant water, skilled workforce, and affordable quality lifestyle opportunities - Virden continues to draw new and diverse families, businesses, and industries to the region.



Housing

The Town of Virden has several new subdivisions including the more recently constructed Bolton Bay as well as Kenderdine Subdivision.

Average house sales range from \$120,000 up to \$350,000+ for newer homes. Monthly rental rates range from \$800-\$1200 on average.

Property Tax

Due Date: October 31 (or the Friday prior) of each year

Payment Methods: Cash, cheque, debit, online banking or e-transfer

Penalties: On all taxes remaining unpaid after the due date, there shall be,

added on the first day of each month, a penalty of 1% until paid or

until the property has been sold for the arrears of taxes.

Tax Sale: All lands in arrears for more than one year on December 31 each year

are liable to be sold for the arrears of taxes.

Tax Prepayment Discount: The Town of Virden offers tax prepayment discounts as outlined

below to taxpayers wishing to pay an installment or installments on their current year's property taxes. Those wishing to prepay may pay an amount or a series of amounts that, in total, does not exceed the amount of their previous year's property taxes. The discount rate is

equivalent to an effective annual interest rate of 3%.

Manitoba Health Information

In order to receive free health care, you must have a Manitoba Health number. All applicants can contact the Manitoba Health Office in Winnipeg at 204–786–7101 or toll-free at 1–800–392–1207 for help in completing the Manitoba Health application.

When applying for a Manitoba health card:

- The Manitoba health card takes approximately four to six weeks to arrive.
- There is no cost to apply for a Manitoba health card and no monthly fees.
- The Manitoba health card is required when visiting a doctor, obtaining services from the hospital, or filling a prescription.

Immunizations:

Immunization is recommended for individuals of all ages to prevent serious illness and disease. Immunizations also protect those who cannot be immunized due to underlying health conditions. For information contact Public Health Services at 204-748-2321 or your doctor.

Pharmacare:

www.gov.mb.ca/health/pharmacare

Pharmacare is a drug benefit program for any Manitoban, regardless of age, whose income is seriously affected by high prescription drug costs. Coverage is based on both your total family income, and the amount you pay for eligible prescription drugs. Each year, you are required to pay a portion of the cost of your eligible prescription drugs. This amount will be your annual Pharmacare deductible. Your deductible is set based on your annual family income. You qualify if:

- You are eligible for Manitoba Health Coverage.
- Your prescriptions are not paid through another provincial or federal program.
- Your prescription drug costs are not fully covered by a drug insurance program.
- Your eligible prescription drug costs exceed your Pharmacare deductible.

Vehicles

If you are purchasing a vehicle you may want to know if it was involved in an accident. MPI Service Centres can do a vehicle search for you in order to provide collision information on a specific vehicle. You must have an accurate serial number with you when you request a vehicle search. If you ask, they will also send out the "estimate sheet" that sets out the details of previous damage. This process can take a few days.

Drivers

If you hold a valid driver's license from another jurisdiction, you may operate a motor vehicle in Manitoba for up to three months. After three months, you will be required to exchange your valid out-of-provide driver's license for an equivalent Manitoba license without completing written and road tests.

Jurisdiction information is available by contacting MPI or visit www.mpi.mb.ca/Pages/new-to-manitoba.aspx if you have a valid driver's license from a jurisdiction that does not have a reciprocal arrangement with Manitoba, you may operate a vehicle in Manitoba for up to three months. After three months, you will be required to successfully complete a knowledge test and a road test. Before taking these tests, you must register as a Manitoba Public Insurance customer and provide proper identification documents.

New licensees will be required to complete the Graduated Driver Licensing (GDL) program. More information can be found at: www.mpi.mb.ca/Pages/graduated-driver-licensing.aspx

The Virden Pioneer Home Museum was established in 1970 and the original two-story house was built in 1888 and depicts a family home in the Victorian Era. Three additional Annexes and a Coach House were added as our collection increased to over 11,000 artefacts that includes a military display, school display, hospital medical display, assorted heritage tools, local business displays and horse drawn buggies and sleighs and other farming related items just to name a few. The museum's purpose is to collect, preserve, research and display their collection of local artefacts, allowing for future generations to learn about local heritage and culture. With the help of summer staff and volunteers Virden Pioneer Museum hosts a Museum Day, usually in August, with a BBQ Fundraiser and heritage activities for the children.

CPR Station Historic Centre

The Canadian Pacific Railway Station was constructed in 1900 after the original wood frame station burnt in 1899. It has been restored and was declared a heritage building in 1994. It's unique fieldstone and overhanging eaves style was common with many rail stations in larger centres.

In the early years of Virden, many new immigrant farmers and businessmen would have first

disembarked from the train at this location and passed through the doors of this station. Today the station houses the Virden and Area Arts Council, and the Virden Chamber of Commerce. Also included is an art gallery by Arts Mosaic, as well as a restored caboose car outside the main entrance, as well as a painted rock garden for treasure hunters of all ages.

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Arts Mosaic was incorporated in 1982, and has been making the arts accessible to our community for over 40 years. They manage an art gallery, located in the CPR Historic Centre, that is open year round and offer workshops in various mediums to all ages. Arts Mosaic oversees the day to day operations of The Costume Closet, and manages an artisans marketplace.

The Aud Theatre was built in 1911 as part of the municipal building. The building was open to the public on February 29, 1912. The building consisted of a government telephone exchange room, a new courtroom, three large offices, and the opera house, costing \$32,500.00. The population of Virden at this time was about 1,500. The Aud Theatre was constructed by W.T. Manser. The comedy "the Mysogynist" was the first play performed in the theatre. The Great Eastern Sign Painting Co. of Toronto supplied the 22x30 ft curtain. During the '30's and '40's, the Aud was used as a movie theatre.

The ceiling on the stage was originally 40 ft high but it was lowered to 24 ft to save heating costs. The building was originally heated by steam which was replaced with electric heat in 1984–1985 after the renovation and re-opening in 1983. When the theatre fell into disrepair it closed as a movie theatre and the town council was preparing to demolish it. A local steering committee was formed to "Save the Aud" and after substantial renovations, it was re-opened in April of 1983. The lower level consists of 257 seats and the upper level consists of 210 seats. The majestic curve of the balcony gives the audience a panoramic view of the stage. On either side, there are two double-decker boxes which adds an air of sophistication.

This structure is a great example of fieldstone construction. Much of the stone for the fieldstone construction came from along the top of the Assiniboine River Valley. The first church was a frame structure building by Clayton & Sons in 1885. This was the first church building in Virden. Masonry work was done by Mr. Saul of Carberry with carpentry done by Mr. Harrington of Winnipeg. Walter Chesterton, a Winnipeg architect, designed this notable structure while building the school across the street. The cloister and fence were added in 1952. The church features two stained glass windows created by famous Ukrainian–Canadian artist and sculptor Leo Mol. The church also features a stained–glass medallion window which was presented by the city of Brugge, Belgium, to honor the 12th Manitoba Dragoons.

Over the noon hour on Thursday, a Community Barbecue in Victoria Park, free of charge and sponsored by COREX Resources, kicks off the rodeo weekend. In the evening, Downtown Daze, organized and facilitated by the Virden Community Chamber of Commerce, takes over the town's main business district. It's a fun, family atmosphere which includes live entertainment, a variety of food and activities for all ages to enjoy. In the Kids' Zone, you'll find inflatables, carnival games and face painting. There's a mechanical bull, local vendors, business displays and much more. Take a trip back in time and check out the vintage rides at the Westman on Wheels Show & Shine in the Virden Farmers Market area, weather permitting. All weekend long,

take in the semiprofessional rodeo action in the Tundra Oil & Gas Place arena. There's a matinee (slack) in the afternoon and evening performances on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, which include mutton busting for the younger set at intermission. The competition attracts top caliber contestants from across the prairies as well as the northern U.S.A., New Zealand and Australia.

On Shootout Sunday, the best cowboys and cowgirls in each of the nine events, as well as the slack, return to compete for a purse of added prize money, championship jackets and saddles. It's Family Day, with rodeo fans 15 and under admitted free of charge.
